Course Description

This course is a survey of women in literature, focusing on women writers' struggles as well as triumphs with culture and society as expressed in the literature they produce. We will look at the historical, philosophical, religious and cultural forces that come to bear upon gendered identities and how women writers have responded to these forces in their works.

Course Objectives

- Obtain a general knowledge of how historical, philosophical, religious and cultural movements have impacted the role of women both as subject and author in literature.
- Obtain a working knowledge of the origins and development of Feminist Criticism in Literature.
- Explore the relationship between gender and language.
- Develop and sharpen skills of literary analysis and interpretation, particularly in regards to the elements of texts, such as symbols, themes, and points of view.
- Demonstrate knowledge of the authors and literary and social movements that produced the texts read in the course.
