授業概要 Course summary	
<p>The main goal of this course is for students to develop their English abilities, cultural understanding, and critical thinking faculties through learning about other cultures and comparing them to their own cultures: evaluate and hypothesize about cultural similarities and differences in the process of engaging in intercultural interaction and identity negotiation. The nominal focus of the class is British culture, but only in the context of comparison with all the cultures we have in the class.</p>	
到達目標 Course goal	
<p>Students should develop their critical thinking faculties and intercultural understanding as they come both to affirm their own identities and see things from multiple diverse perspectives. All 4 skills (reading, writing, listening, and speaking) will be used extensively, so those 4 skills should improve. In addition, students' reflective and critical thinking skills should develop as they benefit from the extensive intercultural interaction, and they should be able to personalize their learning to make it meaningful for them. Intercultural understanding is vital.</p>
