授業概要 Course summary
This course aims to give students an overview and appreciation of the history of English Literature: tracing its development from folklore and then its Old English origins through to Middle English, the Renaissance, and into the 18th Century. This course introduces folklore and the works of Chaucer, Shakespeare, and Swift--writers who have had a major influence on English language, literature, and Western culture.
到達目標 Course goal
Students should develop an appreciation and understanding of some representative English Literature from different eras while also developing their English language ability. All 4 skills (reading, writing, listening, and speaking) will be used extensively, so those 4 skills should improve. In addition, students' reflective and critical thinking skills should develop as they benefit from the extensive intercultural interaction, and they should be able to personalize their learning to make it meaningful for them.
授業内容 Course description
Week 1: course outline. Weeks 2-4: Folklore. Week 5: Old English <i>The Battle of Maldon</i> . Weeks 6-7: Middle English Chaucer's <i>The Canterbury Tales</i> . Weeks 8-11: The Early Modern Period (Shakespeare). Weeks 12-15 Restoration & C18th Prose (Swift's <i>Gulliver's Travels</i> ).
