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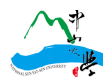

Visa

Students are advised to apply for a visa to enter Taiwan.

One-semester Student

One-semester students are required to apply for a **Visitor Visa** to enter Taiwan and extend their visa 15 days before the 60/90 days of Duration of Stay expires.

One-year Student

Students applying for a full academic year must obtain a **Resident Visa** to enter Taiwan, and they are required to apply for an **Alien Resident Certificate (ARC)** within 15 days after their arrival.

Students are suggested to contact the Taiwan consulate in their country/region for the most up-to-date information.



Insurance & Health Certificate

Insurance

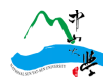
Students must purchase overseas **health and accident insurance** for the whole duration of their stay in Taiwan. The insurance plan in English or Chinese must be submitted on the university's registration day. It is also compulsory for students to purchase the NSYSU Student Group Insurance (326NTD/semester). The fee will be included in the invoice given upon orientation.

One-year students who hold an ARC for more than 6 months are eligible to apply for the NHI (National Health Insurance). They need to contact the OIA coordinator once they are eligible to apply for an NHI card.

Health Examination

All exchange students are required to complete health examinations before coming to Taiwan.

There are 5 course selection phases for exchange students to choose courses. The first online course selection period will start one to two weeks before class begins.

- (1) Preliminary Course Selection II.
- (2) Add & Drop I.
- (3) Add & Drop II,
- (4) Exceptional Circumstances
- (5) Withdrawal

Credit and Grading System

Every 18 hours is counted as 1 credit.

A 3-credit course will have 54 hours of class in one semester.

1 Credit = 2 ECTS

Areas of Study Open to Exchange Students

All fields are open to exchange students as long as the student has adequate Chinese proficiency. Otherwise, students can only take courses offered in English.

Students are allowed to choose courses from different disciplines and levels.

Some master-level courses are only open to exchange students in a later selection phase.

Chinese Language Course



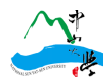
Free Chinese Language Class for Exchange Students

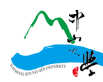
